

66 My group volunteered on the 2nd day at WeNeedBooks, a group of about 12. We helped create and finalize a social media content calendar, build an email marketing strategy, and finished painting the walls outside that the previous group had started. It was amazing to hear the story of how WNB was founded and started, and finishing by taking a walk through the community and hearing about how WNB is making a difference in the local community. It felt like our group was able to make a big impact with how many languages our team speaks to help with coding and writing summaries of the books.
